Important: Safety information about video games

About photosensitive seizures

A very small percentage of people may experience a seizure when exposed to certain visual images, including flashing lights or patterns that may appear in video games. Even people who have no history of seizures or epilepsy may have an undiagnosed condition that can cause photosensitive epileptic seizures while watching video games. These seizures may have a variety of symptoms, including lightheadedness, altered vision, eye or face twitching, jerking or shaking of arms or legs, disorientation, confusion, or momentary loss of awareness. Seizures may also cause loss of consciousness or convulsions that can lead to injury from falling down or striking nearby objects.

Immediately stop playing and consult a doctor if you experience any of these symptoms. Adults who allow teenagers (or children) to play the games should watch for or ask their children about these symptoms as they are more likely than adults to experience these seizures. The risk of photosensitive epileptic seizures may be reduced by playing in a well-lit room and by not playing when you are drowsy or fatigued. If you or any of your relatives have a history of seizures or epilepsy, consult a doctor before playing.

Play safely

Take a break from playing games at least every half hour. Stop playing immediately if you begin to feel tired or if you experience an unpleasant sensation or pain in your hands and/or arms. If the condition persists, consult a doctor. Use of vibration can aggravate injuries. Do not turn vibration on if you have any ailment in the bones or joints of your fingers, hands, wrists, or arms.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Your game card and game deck are products of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you protect your warranty coverage and enjoy your game for many years.


- Keep the game card and game deck dry. Precipitation, humidity and all types of liquids or moisture can contain minerals that will corrode electronic circuits.
- Do not use or store the game card and game deck in dusty, dirty areas.
- Do not store the game card and game deck in hot areas.
- Do not store the game card and game deck in cold areas. When the game deck returns to its normal temperature, moisture can form inside the game deck and damage electronic circuit boards.
- Do not attempt to open the game card or game deck other than as instructed in the user guide.
- Do not drop, knock, or shake the game card and game deck.
- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean the game card or game deck.
- Keep the game card out of the reach of small children.

All of the above suggestions apply equally to your game card, game deck, and any enhancement.

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Inserting the N-Gage Game Card

1. Make sure the N-Gage game deck is switched off. If it's on, press and hold  to switch off the device.
2. With the back of the N-Gage game deck facing you, slide open the cover (Fig. 1).
3. Slide finger into the finger slot, then lift and remove the battery (Fig. 2).
4. Remove the existing game card or memory card (if you have one fitted).
5. Position the N-Gage game card in its slot. Make sure that the gold contacts of the card are facing down and lined up with the gold contacts on the device (Fig. 3).
6. When you have secured the card in place, replace the battery, then replace the cover by sliding it back into place (Fig. 4).





Note: A SIM card must be inserted in the N-Gage game deck before a game can be played. Insert a SIM card as described in the N-Gage game deck instruction manual.

Starting a game

Turn the power switch on.

The game icon will automatically appear on the Menu screen once the game card is successfully installed.

Press , scroll to the game icon and press . Now you're ready to start the game.

Do not use the USB port during gameplay.

Bluetooth Multiplayer Game Play*

* To play the game with other users in Bluetooth multiplayer mode, all participants need to have a copy of the game card.

MAIN MENU

After pressing the power key  and selecting Virtua Tennis from the menu, the logo screen will appear, followed by the Title Screen. Pressing one of the game keys will bring up the Main Menu with the following four choices:

ARCADE

Play against the computer in an arcade-style knockout tournament.
(See P.8)

EXHIBITION

Free play. Up to 2 people may play at the same time using Bluetooth. (See P.9)

WORLD TOUR

Create your own player and compete in world competitions.
(See P.11)

OPTIONS

Change settings for ARCADE and EXHIBITION modes.
(See P.14)

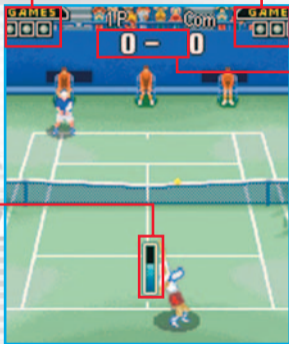
GAME SCREEN

Game Counter

The number of games won. Only displayed when a point is scored, not during gameplay.



Serve Gauge

Only displayed when serving. (See P.7)





Score

The current score. Only displayed when a point is scored, not during gameplay.

Pressing the Left  or Right  Selection Key during gameplay will bring up the Pause Menu.

SERVING THE BALL

1. Toss the ball up by pressing the 5 Key  or the 7 Key .

2. Pressing the 5 Key  or the 7 Key  again will cause the player to hit the ball. Pressing the 5 Key will hit a spin serve (the ball bounces high after the rebound). Pressing the 7 Key will hit a slice serve (the ball bounces low and to the side after the rebound).

*As the number of games played increases, the balls speed up and the risk of faulting also increases. However, the risk of faulting is low if the ball is served while the gauge is at MAX.

*By pressing the Controller Key  while serving, the player can aim for a specific area of the service box (example: pressing left/up will aim for the left-rear of the opponent's service box).

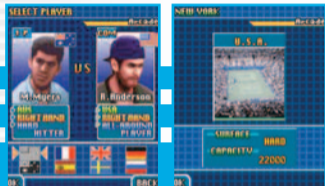


ARCADE

Select one player from the eight pre-created players and compete in a knockout tournament against the computer. Winners receive awards, and depending on the awards received, can enter the Top 10 Rankings.

ARCADE PLAY

1. Select [ARCADE] from the Main Menu.
2. Select Player.
3. Computer selects opponent.
Press OK to continue.
4. Stage is automatically selected. Press OK to continue.
5. The match begins.

EXHIBITION

Play a single player match against the computer, go multiplayer against a friend or play in a multiplayer doubles match.

EXHIBITION PLAY (SINGLE)

1. Select [EXHIBITION] [SINGLE] from the Main Menu.
2. Adjust settings for the match.
3. Select players for both yourself and the computer.
4. Select a stage.
5. The match begins.



EXHIBITION PLAY (MULTI)

1. Select [EXHIBITION] [MULTI] from the Title Menu.
2. Set up a Bluetooth game with a friend (See P.15).
3. The match begins.

EXHIBITION SETTINGS

- [GAME COUNT] Change the number of games.
 [DEUCE] Turn DEUCE ON/OFF.
 [TIE BREAK] Turn TIE BREAK ON/OFF.
 [CPU LEVEL] Change difficulty level.
 [POSITION] Select Normal/Reverse.

EXHIBITION PAUSE MENU

- [CONTINUE] Return to game and continue playing.
 [END GAME] End game and return to Main Menu.



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WORLD TOUR

Create your own character and improve his abilities while playing on the World Tour.

WORLD TOUR PLAY

1. Select [WORLD TOUR] from the Main Menu.

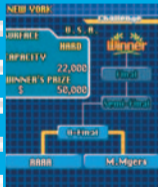
4. Accept the World Tour invitation. Press OK to continue.

7. Your opponent is introduced. Press OK to continue.

8. The match begins.





Player Edit Screen

The following details can be changed in the Player Edit Screen:

- [NAME]** Enter the character's name.
- [EDIT COLOR]** Customize your character's hair, skin and uniform.
- [PLAYER STYLE]** Make your player left or right handed and select his playing style.



World Map Screen

Choose a tournament by pressing left or right on the Controller Key  and enter it by pressing 5 .

Pressing the Left Selection Key  will display [STATUS Screen-A].



STATUS SCREEN-A

The following items are displayed in [STATUS Screen-A]:

- [NAME]** Player Character's name.
- [RANK]** Ranking on the WORLD TOUR.
- [CLEARED MATCHES]** Number of matches won.
- [TOTAL MONEY]** Total money won on the WORLD TOUR.

Pressing the Left Selection Key  will display the OPTIONS Menu.



STATUS SCREEN-B

After a win, the following details are displayed based on gameplay during the match:

[POWER] Increases when many serves are hit with the Serve Gauge at MAX.

[FOOTWORK] Increases when the player runs for a long time.

[CONTROL] Increases when there are few missed shots.

[STAMINA] Increases when rallying for a long time.

*[Serve], [Stroke], [Volley], [Smash] and [Lob] abilities will be affected by the above parameters.



OPTIONS MENU

[SAVE] Save game.

[END GAME] Return to the Main Menu. If game hasn't been saved, a warning message will appear.

[EXIT] Return to World Map.



WORLD TOUR PAUSE MENU

[CONTINUE] Return to game and continue playing.

[WORLD MAP] End game and return to World Map.

OPTIONS

OPTIONS

[ARCADE] (See P.8) and [EXHIBITION] (See P.9) settings can be changed here.

[CPU LEVEL] Change difficulty level.

[GAME COUNT] Change the number of games.

[TIE BREAK] Turn TIE BREAK ON/OFF.

[DEUCE] Turn DEUCE ON/OFF.

[RANKINGS] Display Top 10 Rankings.

[SOUND VOLUME] Adjust the volume of the background music.

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MULTIPLAYER GAMES USING BLUETOOTH

Below is an explanation of how to connect two N-GAGE game decks for multiplayer action in Exhibition Mode using Bluetooth:

1. Select [EXHIBITION] [MULTI] to display the Master/Client selection screen. Assign one N-GAGE unit as the Master and the other as the Client. The Master becomes Player 1 and the Client becomes Player 2.
2. The Master (Player 1) then moves to the game rules selection screen and match style (Singles/Doubles) selection screen. Choose the settings for the game and select 'OK' to confirm. Wait in standby until a connection is established with the Client (Player 2).
3. The Client (Player 2) moves to the Master selection screen. Check that the name of the Master (N-GAGE unit) is displayed in the window at the bottom of the screen and select "OK". If the Master's name is not displayed, the Bluetooth connection may be faulty. In this case, quit the game and check that the Bluetooth settings are correct before trying again.
4. Once a connection has been established, the position selection screen is displayed. The Master (Player 1) must select either the Service side (near side of the court serves first) or the Receiving side (far side of the court receives service first). For doubles matches, choose Fore or Back. The Client (Player 2) cannot make selections.
5. Finally, Master and Client each choose a player and the game starts.
